Proceeds have helped fund research that has identified and tested new drugs for hemangiosarcoma, bone cancer and soft-tissue sarcomas; made chemotherapy safer and more effective; and discovered genetic information that could improve prognostic tests for lymphoma.

"Cancer is a disease that touches many of us," said Mary Gardner, DVM, chairperson of the South Florida Walk committee. "Morris Animal Foundation is working with the very best in veterinary medicine to find a cure for canine cancer.
