- Maintaining study databases and tracking spreadsheets
- Requesting medical records and tissue specimens for use in pathology confirmation and future research studies
- Responding to unscheduled kit requests as needed and escalating to the fulfillment team
- Participating in building a culture of accountability, performance and trust
- Promoting and adhering to Foundation Core Values: Excellence, Respect, Compassion, Collaboration, Innovation, and Determination
